Hi Greg,

We have not had any issues that I am aware of. Keep in mind, most folks are referred for failing the risk assessment and/or the distance visual check and/or the near visual check. By the time they reach the FDT machine, they are already a referral for an eye exam.

Also, we do emphasize that it is just a screening and we never diagnose with Glaucoma.

Just that the screening indicates they should go in for a complete eye exam.

There are times when folks have poor visual acuity that it is difficult for the to do the FDT machine and so they are referred for an indication from the machine, but also because they have poor visual acuity.

Hope that helps.
